

Seatoun RSA House Rules

We have five basic rules to ensure that all members and guests can enjoy their use of the club.

Respect for other members

1. A tidy standard of dress is required.
 - Please be tidily dressed – no jandals, workboots, scruffy jeans, etc after 7pm.
 - Please don't wear T-shirts with offensive or inappropriate words or designs.
 - Please refrain from wearing low-riders that reveal boxer shorts or bare skin.
2. Please be considerate to other members.
 - Please use moderate language. The spirit of our "No Swearing Aloud" sign is to be obeyed, and offenders are traditionally required to apologise to the sign.
 - Please refrain from behaviour which may offend, insult or embarrass other members or their guests.

Respect for our neighbours

3. The club is a good neighbour. The club is part of the Community, and has neighbours on both sides.
 - Please come and go quietly – refrain from shouting, tooting your horn, or other loud behaviour when you are outside the clubrooms.
 - If you drive to the club, please use the club's car park in preference to residents' parking spaces on the street. *Please be extra careful leaving the driveway – visibility of pedestrians on the footpath is poor.*
 - Please respect our neighbours' rights to privacy and peaceful occupation.

Respect for the club

4. The club is a responsible host. The club holds liquor and gaming licences which depend on the good behaviour of our members.
 - If you invite guests to the club who are not members, it is *essential* that you sign them in on the Visitors Book in the upstairs lobby.
 - Please don't arrive at the club intoxicated, or display drunken behaviour on the premises or when leaving. The club has an obligation to refuse service to intoxicated persons.
 - Don't drive home if you may be 'over the limit'. A free phone is available in the upstairs lobby – call a taxi or get a lift instead.
 - Please use the gaming machines responsibly. Pamphlets are available at the club which provide help with problem gambling.

Respect for our community heritage

5. The Bowling Club brings with it almost 100 years of community history, and the RSA holds the legacy of the men and women who have served New Zealand through many years. We are respectful of that heritage.
 - Please follow the guidelines above.
 - At 6pm on most evenings, the club pauses briefly to remember those who fell in service to our country. Please join with us to do so.
